Noise

Keep music at reasonable levels.
 The Chain O' Lakes is a family-friendly environment – please use appropriate language and behavior. Local ordinance prohibits profane lyrics and loud noise.

PFD

- It is illegal to operate any boat or paddleboard unless a personal flotation device (PFD) of the proper size is readily accessible for each person on board.
- Boats 16 feet or longer must also have a throwable PFD.
- All PFDs must be readily accessible and of proper size for intended wearer.

Hazardous Wake/High Water

- It is illegal to operate a vessel in a manner that creates hazardous wave or wake conditions.
- Do not intentionally create enhanced wakes that may cause property damage, erosion, displacement of the lake bottom and personal injury.
- Be responsible for your wake Wisconsin law holds you liable for property damage.

Negligent/Reckless Behavior

- Boaters must stop immediately when signaled by a law officer and/or a flashing blue light.
- Motorboats and PWCs shall yield the right of way to canoes, kayaks, sailboats or any other non-motorized craft.

It is unlawful to:

- Operate a motorboat while a passenger is sitting on the gunwales, tops, backs or sides of the seats, or on the decking over the bow while underway.
- To operate a motorboat at a speed in excess of NO Wake from one-half hour after sunset to sunrise.
- To operate a PWC after sunset to sunrise.
- To move, tamper with, or destroy any official marker or to tie a boat to any waterway marker.
- To throw refuse, including lawn waste into the water or upon public or private property.
- To power load a boat onto a trailer.
- To operate a motorboat or use water skis, a surfboard, or other deviece if s/he is under the influence of an intoxicant, controlled substance or has a blood alcohol concentration of 0.08% or more.
- To chase, harass or disturb wildlife with your vessel.





BOAT-CHECK TIPS :

- Never transfer water, plants, animals, or mud from one body of water to another.
- Inspect your boat, trailer, and equipment and remove plants, animals and mud before launching or transporting your boat.
- Drain water from your boat, motor, ballast tanks, bilge, live well and bait containers before leaving the water access.
- Dispose of unwanted bait and aquatic plants in the trash.
- Spray/rinse boats and equipment to remove microscopic invasives, OR dry boats and equipment for at least five days.
