= Slow, "No Wake" Speed

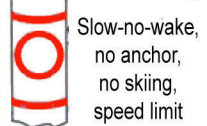
= Reasonable speed allowed (sunrise - 1/2 hr after sunset)

Warns of bridge work, rocks, cables, shallow areas and dams

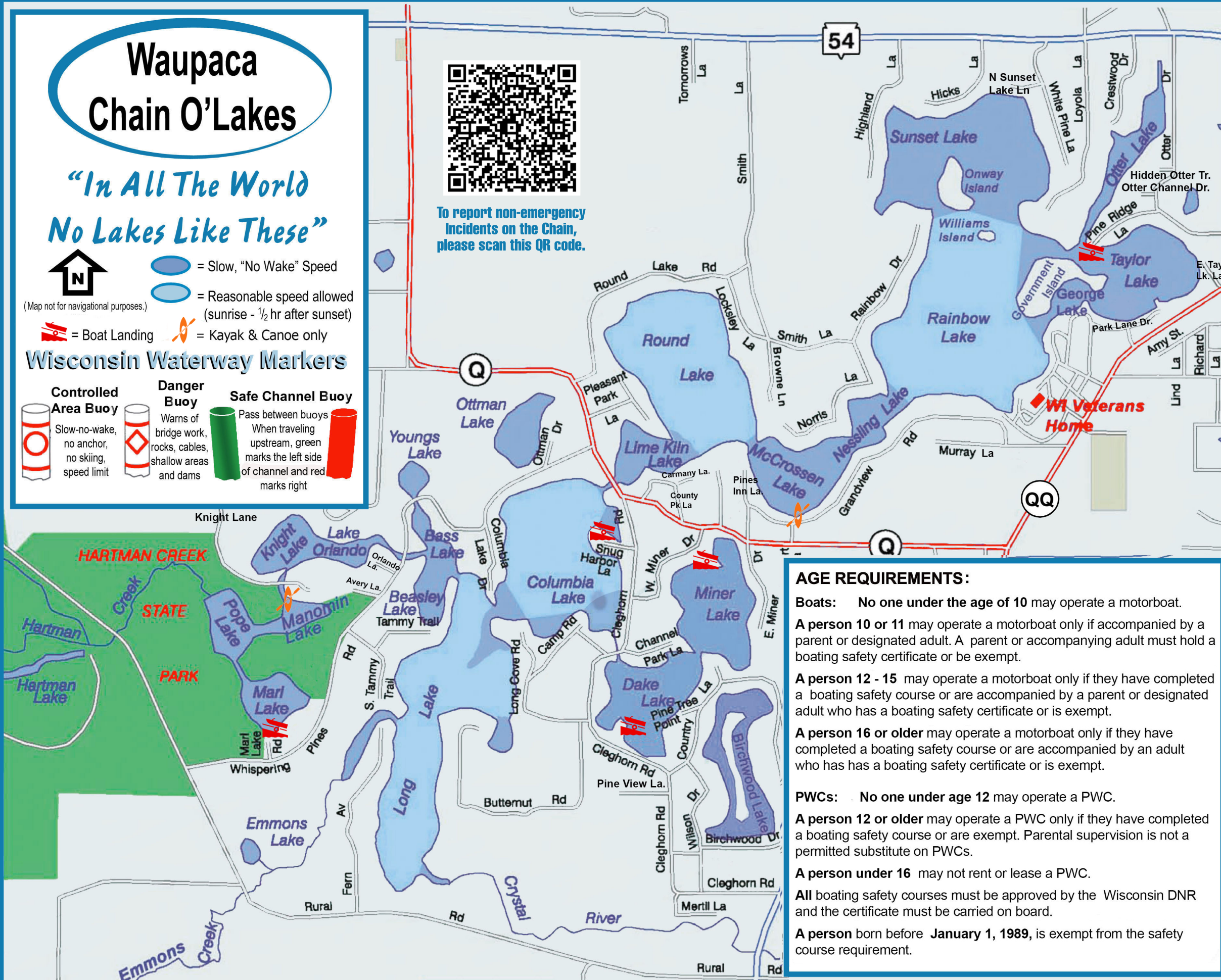
Safe Channel Buoy



Pass between buoys When traveling upstream, green marks the left side of channel and red marks right

"SLOW, NO WAKE SPEED" means a speed at which a vessel moves as slowly as possible while still maintaining steerage control.

WATER SKIING/TOWING RULES

- Only on Rainbow, Round, Columbia and Long.
- Tow in counter clockwise direction.
- Boat pulling a skier must have a qualified observer OR equipped with a wide angle rearview mirror.
- PWC must be designed and recommended by the manufacturer to accommodate at least three people AND have competent observer or wide-angle rear-view mirror.
- Do not tow within 100 feet of swimmers, rafts, piers and anchored boats.
- Towing any recreational device, including a tube is considered skiing.

AGE REQUIREMENTS:

Boats: No one under the age of 10 may operate a motorboat.

A person 10 or 11 may operate a motorboat only if accompanied by a parent or designated adult. A parent or accompanying adult must hold a boating safety certificate or be exempt.

A person 12 - 15 may operate a motorboat only if they have completed a boating safety course or are accompanied by a parent or designated adult who has a boating safety certificate or is exempt.

A person 16 or older may operate a motorboat only if they have completed a boating safety course or are accompanied by an adult who has a boating safety certificate or is exempt.

PWCs: No one under age 12 may operate a PWC.

A person 12 or older may operate a PWC only if they have completed a boating safety course or are exempt. Parental supervision is not a permitted substitute on PWCs.

A person under 16 may not rent or lease a PWC.

All boating safety courses must be approved by the Wisconsin DNR and the certificate must be carried on board.

A person born before January 1, 1989, is exempt from the safety course requirement.

To report a non-emergency incident, scan QR code (upper left of map).

It is illegal to operate, at a speed in excess of 'SLOW, NO WAKE SPEED':

- A motorboat, other than a PWC, within 100 feet of the shoreline
- A PWC within 200 feet of the shoreline
- A vessel within 100 feet of swimmers, dock, pier, raft or restricted area.
- A PWC within 100 feet of any other vessel.
